The average KS 2 pts score per eligible pupil is 30.5 (National 28.7)

The National Curriculum standards have been designed so that most pupils will progress by approximately one level every two years. This means that by the end of Key Stage 2 (age 11), pupils are expected to achieve Level 4. Level 5 is exceeding the national average for all pupils and level 6 (introduced 2012) is for very high attainers in specific subjects.
