

#### Dear Parents

A very warm welcome to the 2013/14 academic year .....it's great to be back!

Firstly, thank you for your support that ensured a smooth start to the new term with children arriving on time, smartly dressed and with a smile! It has been a real pleasure listening to the children sharing stories about their adventures during the holiday break. With term 1 now underway there is a great deal planned in support of their learning. We continue to implement our revised curriculum in preparation for the proposed 'new' primary curriculum in 2014. As usual parents will shortly receive information about the programmes of study including your child's individual targets. Please play an active part in supporting your child's learning, whether sharing a book, asking about their day or undertaking activities to extend their experience. We maintain our focus on 'Assessment for Learning'. Our 'WAGOLL' (What A Good One Looks Like) character is well know in the school and helps the children to 'see' the steps that make learning relevant and most importantly, enjoyable.

As mentioned in the final newsletter of 2012/13, one of our key priorities for 2013/14 is the further development of writing. We will look to strengthen and extend the children's approach to ensure they are confident, happy writers. We are planning 'writing days' where the children draw upon their experiences, 'crafting' their ideas to produce high quality results for everyone to enjoy.

We have recently taken receipt of £5000 worth of high quality reading books! They will support our phonic programme and guided reading scheme for all children. Whilst this is part of a government matched funding scheme, a huge thanks to the Parents Association who contributed over 50% to make it happen!
