Clearly it is a time when many children are walking/cycling to school with their parents and travelling at a slower speed will help ensure everyone is safe. Thank you for you help.

Lateness

Can we remind parents that we expect children to be on time for school every day. The school day at Eastington starts at 8.50. We open our gates at 8.40 to allow children to enjoy the company of others and to help parents drop and go. Lateness for school should be an exceptional circumstance.

Starting the day late is never a positive experience for the child, other children in the class or the teaching team. For the child who is late it is awkward entering the classroom and having to register & organise lunch. In addition they might have missed the overview of the day given by the teacher which can leave some children disorientated and even upset. Instructions for the start of a lesson can be missed which puts the child at a disadvantage and can impact on their learning in a negative way.

For the other children to have their time wasted is frustrating and unfair. Sometimes TAs are taken from an intervention they have started to settle the late child into class or organise class & lunch registers which interrupts the learning of another pupil.

For the teacher it is a challenge to start the registers or lesson repeatedly knowing learning is being impaired for the other children in the class.

Please help your child with their learning by arriving on time for school every day.
