You should have received information regarding the lunch service that will be operated from September. Parents of pupils in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 who wish their child to receive a hot meal will need to activate their 'ParentPay' account before the start of the term and ensure there is adequate funds to cover the cost. (Instructions and account details previously sent home in a sealed envelope). Parents of pupils in the Reception Year, Year 1 and 2 are entitled to a free school meal and therefore simply need to inform the school on a daily basis their choice of meal. A reminder that the system is flexible and parents wishing their child to continue with sandwich lunches may do so or opt to have a school meal on a day to day basis. Thank you.

Looking back.....

As another academic year draws to a close, we have much to celebrate. It seems only vesterday that Classes 1 and 2 enchanted us with their version of the Christmas Nativity and (not to be outdone), the junior Classes transported us to a chocolate factory where we followed Charlie's dream of finding the golden ticket! Sporting successes have included the school teams reaching the finals of the 6-a-side and our tag rugby teams just being pipped at the post for a place in the Stroud finals. The country dancing festival early in the year and (more recently) an inspirational musical evening reflects the wide opportunities for children to excel. Throughout the year, a whole range of educational visits have supported the children's learning including a number of special quests, who helped bring topics to life by sharing their expertise and experiences. It was lovely to see our friends from Charles Dickens Primary (London) who visited Eastington in October and once again our visitors from Japan provided a much broader cultural experience for our children when they visited in March. Heart warming letters from our friends at Langa Langa Primary School in Kenya highlighted the importance of global awareness and celebrating diversity. Winning the Stroud Schools Mock Trial (again!), the success of the Business Enterprise and all the traditional whole school events help to make Eastington the place it is. We should also remember the hard work and additional time given so willingly by members of the Parents Association. Thank you to the team for their fantastic support this year, enabling the school to purchase new computer equipment. 2013/14 also saw the return of Mrs Wood following her maternity leave and new additions to the Taylor and Childs families.

Looking forward.....

2014/15 promises to be another busy and exciting year for Eastington. As with many schools, we see the introduction of the 'new' curriculum in line with national guidance. There are changes to SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disability) incorporating a more holistic approach within an Education, Health and Care Plan for pupils requiring additional support. We await further guidance from the DfE regarding the use of levels' to determine pupil progress and the school inspection process is currently under review. Whilst there will always be educational evolution, there are constants in the day to day provision we offer the children. Maintaining high expectations through quality teaching and learning, celebrating achievement, valuing what everyone brings and ensuring a safe and positive environment where children enjoy learning.

One of our key priorities for 2014/15 is the further development of writing. We will look to strengthen and extend the children's approach to ensure they are confident, happy writers. We are once again planning 'writing days' where the children draw upon their experiences, 'crafting' their ideas to produce high quality results. We are also organising a 'problem solving day' to extend the children's use and application of Mathematics. With technology now a part of everyday life, we are hoping to provide additional resources (ipads/tablets etc.) to support the introduction of 'coding' and computer science. We, will however, continue to support the children with making informed and sensible choices when using the internet so they remain safe at home as well as school. We are using the additional PE funding to extend our multi skills programme and sports leadership initiative with Jason Boon (professional tennis coach). French and digital photography continues for all pupils in KS 2 with educational visits planned throughout the year for all Year groups. Above all, we aim that learning is purposeful, challenging, and engaging.

'Goodbye' and Good luck'

We say farewell to pupils in Year 6 who leave us to begin their secondary education in September. We wish them every success and hope that a 'little of Eastington Primary' remains with them alwaysgood luck and take care.
