life changing incident he has worked relentlessly to challenge himself and to stay fit and focused and become the best he can be. All the children in the school listened to Andy's story. They asked some interesting and thoughtful questions.

The children in Y5, who are Sports Young Leaders and have been preparing for the launch of positive playtimes with Mrs Childs, enjoyed working with Andy for a longer period. They focused on the five aspects of well-being: Be Active, Give, Keep Learning, Take Notice and Connect. The children undertook role play and sport activities. Andy was impressed with how our children supported each



other without being asked and how well they behaved through their activities together. An inspiring day.
