Looking ahead: What impact will our reflection have? What will we celebrate, change or do that that will bring positive change about.

As part of this we are planning an active reflection day in Spring Term on core values such as friendship, forgiveness etc. We hope that reflective stations will be set up in the hall so classes can come in and have a short time to reflect. We will aim to give you an opportunity to come after school and join in too. More information will follow when the day has been finalised.
