Attendance

There has been some recent guidance from the Department for Education around attendance and as a result we are updating our Attendance Policy—when completed a copy will be found on the school's website and in the front entrance. More detailed information will follow next year. Here are the key points around keeping children safe in education and the responsibility of parents and agencies in working together to achieve this:

- If your child is moving to a new home, discuss this with us and inform the school office of the parent they will live with, the new home address and the date of move
- If your child is moving to a new school, discuss this with us and inform the school office of the new school name/address and the date started/planned date to start.
- The school will inform the LA if a child is at risk of being 'missing in education'.

Norovirus—Information sharing request from the NHS

Norovirus causes viral gastroenteritis, which is characterised by the sudden onset of vomiting and/or diarrhoea, it can spread rapidly in closed environments such as schools, childcare settings, hospitals and nursing homes. However, most people do not require treatment and recover at home within one or two days. Norovirus is easily transmitted from person to person and by consuming contaminated food or water or by contact with contaminated surfaces or objects. Please help by following this advice. Children with symptoms of norovirus should:

- Keep hydrated by drinking fluids as tolerated.
- If symptoms persist (more than 48 hours), phone the GP or the NHS non-emergency number 111 for advice.
- Wash hands thoroughly with soap and water. Alcohol hand gel is not effective against norovirus.
- Stay away from school until they have been free of symptoms for at least 48 hours and avoid contact with others where possible.
- Do not visit friends or relatives in hospital or residential care homes as there is a real risk of introducing the infection to the establishment.
