### **INSET Day**

Many parents and children wonder what we do on INSET days. Though lots of tea and coffee are involved they are important days when the whole staff are together to review the impact of initiatives and undertake training to support further improvement. The teacher's had a productive INSET day at the start of this term. We reviewed our safeguarding procedures again to ensure we undertake our responsibilities in line with best practise. In addition we enjoyed a practical session on two maths problem strategies which your children will be taught over this term: 'act it out' and 'working backwards'. Do ask your children about these. All staff had a helpful and thought-provoking autism awareness session led by Sara Stephens from the LA Advisory Team too. Investing in all our staff in this way ensures we develop a consistent, positive and coherent approach to all aspects of school life.

# **Reflection Day**
