Reflections on trust

We have been exploring the important values of honesty and trust for the last three weeks through assemblies. The children were great at explaining that trust is when you have a belief that someone is reliable, honest and responsible. We used the model of reflection that Miss Dracup developed to help us think through our ideas:

Looking out: Picture someone you trust. Why do you trust them?

Looking in: Think about a time when you have been trusted. How did it make you feel?

Looking ahead: Decide on one thing you could do or say so other people know they can trust you?

The children's thoughts:

- It was great when a friend trusted me with a good secret, it made me feel great inside. Daisy
- When someone trusts you it makes you feel important and it fills your bucket. Ruth, Freya & Anna
- Cameron fell over when we were playing tag and instead of carrying on I stopped and helped him so he knows he can trust me. Adam

When we thought about it we realised that our school was full of children who are trustworthy.

Talk for Writing

The teachers and TAs have loved being part of a Talk for Writing project for the last year—the aim being to further improve the quality of writing within our school. Teachers and TAs have worked together with Pie Corbett, a leading educationalist, to reflect on their teaching and learn new techniques. Here are their thoughts:


