#### **Health Week**

Though we are delighted to have achieved Gloucestershire's Healthy Living and Learning Schools Award, we are continuing to develop sports and wellbeing for children in our school this year. We are excited to be holding a health week at the end of this term. The children will be exploring how to look after their mental and physical wellbeing over the week. We have practical mindfulness workshops planned and fun sessions with our sports coaches. Children will be considering the importance of resilience using ideas from Gloucestershire Healthy Living and Learning too. There will be a mindfulness session for parents on Tuesday at 2.50pm. Do come and join in —everyone is welcome even if you've never tried a mindfulness session before.

#### **Mathletics**

Mathletics is a wonderful internet resource which can be used at home and at school for maths learning. It is designed to provide children with an enjoyable and safe learning experience. It has an adaptive curriculum which means it alters to suit the ability of the child. Children play games that are aligned to the maths curriculum and gain rewards. Some games mean your child can play with other children around the world. As a school we buy logins for every pupil so children can use it at home and school (supported by our fantastic PA). Your child has recently used Mathletics at school and they should know their login. Many of our children use Mathletics weekly at home but if your child is not using this at the moment then please do login with them and explore the site.

### **Popcorn Night**

Key Stage One children enjoyed Sherlock Gnomes at the recent PA led Popcorn Night. The children loved dressing in their onesies and dressing gowns and snuggling down on furry throws.
