The focus of learning were the effects and risks associated with drugs such as alcohol and tobacco and how to keep bodies and minds healthy. It was wonderful to see many pupils seeking Anita, the session leader, at break times/lunch times with further questions. ### Curriculum news: how we know pupils are making progress

I believe this is an exciting time in education and one that provides the school with the opportunity to devise a permanent assessment system for reading, writing and mathematics, that is rigorous, efficient and clear for all users. The teachers and I have been working hard on devising and implementing such an assessment system in line with the current curriculum that allows pupil progress and attainment to be tracked. The system uses the language of 'Working Below', 'Working Towards', 'Working At', 'Working at Greater Depth' in relation to the age related expectations to describe the attainment of pupils. We are now moderating work internally and externally with other schools to ensure accuracy. The system is in it's infancy but we are confident it will be robust enough to be used for a sustained period to ensure consistency over time. Most importantly it will offer the opportunity to celebrate what children know/can apply and ensure appropriate challenge is given to learners.

### Governor of the month

Katrina Naphine, one of our Governor team, enjoyed a day exploring school life with us in February as part of our monitoring system. She focused on pupils targets and saw that pupils were able to discuss their learning and next steps to improve. She also spent time discussing financial choices as we budget for next year. The 'external' view was informative for us and enabled her to deepen her knowledge of the school and the provision we offer.
