School meals September 2014

Firstly, thank you all those parents of pupils who will be in Years 3-6 from September 2014, who have responded to the hot meals questionnaire sent home recently. As you are aware the government announced that every child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will receive a free school lunch from September 2014. The governors at Eastington have proposed that this provision is extended to pupils in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 by using the 'parent pay' facility. Results collated to date show that approximately 50% of parents of pupils in Key Stage 2 (juniors) would be interested in paying for a hot lunch. Whilst there is likely to be fluctuations with take up on a daily and weekly basis, the school meals contractor considers this a viable option. A reminder that the closing date for all questionnaires is Friday 14th March. I have organised for representatives from Edwards and Ward (Glos LA school meals contractor) to be in the school hall during the parents consultation evenings next week (12th/13th March) from 3.30pm onwards. This should provide an opportunity for parents to 'see' sample meals and ask any relevant questions about the service. It is important to stress, however, that parents may wish to continue to provide a packed lunch as they do now. Further details will follow regarding the 'parent pay' facility for families in Key Stage 2 and how the menu and selection service is to be co-ordinated.
